From Kansas City take 210 East to the "T" Exit, drive north following it to Royle Street.

Take Royle Street west to the Museum (about 6 blocks).

From the North or South, take Highway 13 to Main Street. Turn West on Main through the square, take Burns Street south to Ruby, Ruby to Royle Street and Royle to the Ray County Museum. You can see the Museum from the intersection of Royle and Ruby.
